To be eligible for bus funding reimbursement for Shaker Museum at South Union's BUS Fund, schools must:

- Schedule and take a school group tour at the Shaker Museum at South Union for themed tours *The Shaker Schoolhouse Experience* (May 1- June 5) or *General School Tour* (Aug. 1- Nov. 30) or *Christmas Dinner in 1909* (Dec. 7-18);
- Complete this Bus Fund Reimbursement form (also found on www.shakermuseum.com Plan Your Visit tab);
- Make a copy of bus transportation fuel mileage receipt;
